Dear Parents/Carers, Each year the school is allocated some funding to improve learning by reducing the gap linked to lower incomes. With this in mind please can I encourage any families who are entitled to Free School Meals due to their income, to apply for this entitlement.

Pupils with parents in receipt of any of the following are entitled to free school meals:

- Income Support or Income-Based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Any Income Related element of Employment & Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (with no working tax credit) and whose annual income is £16,105 or less
- \bullet Working Tax Credit & Child Tax Credit when annual income is $\pounds 6,420 \mbox{ or less}$
- Universal Credit where monthly income is less than £610

What We Are Learning in Broxburn Primary School?

Primary I have been learning addition in Maths when adding money up to 20, which helps when they are older. They have also been learning about adding numbers on a number line. They are also very busy learning about inventions such as the telephone made by Alexander Graham Bell, how electricity works, and how to open files on a laptop. They are also learning the basic life cycles of the Earth and facts about Scotland.

Primary 2 have been learning the basic features of castles. In Maths they have been adding numbers up to 100 and o'clock and half past in time. In Literacy they have been learning about verbs, proper nouns and writing stories. In art they are also drawing castles! In Health and Wellbeing they are learning about different types of medicines. They have also learned certain beats in music.

Primary 3 have been learning about the Vikings in their topic. They have been drawing the Viking dragon heads that appear on boats to make people scared. In maths they have been learning how to tell the time in digital and analogue and have been learning how to improvise in drama. They have also been learning the birthdays in French and times tables in Maths. P3 are also learning joined-up writing in handwriting.

Primary 4 have been learning Charlotte's Web in their topic while looking at different types of farms, animals and food. They are also busy looking at the healthy eating food triangle. Again P4 have been learning times tables and the forces of the Earth. Their reading buddies have also helped them improve reading skills. P4 have also been learning different measurement when looking at area. They have also been painting portraits of people and animals.

Primary 5 have been learning Oompa Loompa dances for their topic in PE. They went to the Strathbrock Centre to measure the stage for their show. P5 were also looking at a book Roald Dahl was writing but did not finish, due to the fact he died. In S.T.E.M they were looking at how to send an email. P5 have also been learning how to sew different objects. They are also working towards their show.

Primary 6 have been learning about WW2, healthy eating and ordering fractions in maths. They are also looking at how to write a newspaper in Literacy. They are also learning about the nets of different shapes and angles in Maths, they regularly practice their tables. In S.T.E.M they are focused on making a lander that supports the impact and can keep the marshmallows/aliens in. In Social Studies they are also looking at the fastest car which is Bloodhound SSC.

Primary 7 have been learning more about WW2, the Holocaust and about what concentration camps were like. In writing they have been writing persuasive letters, to people such as smokers. In Maths they looked at the nets of 3D shapes and also focused on negative numbers. In Reading Rotations, where they swap activities to improve literacy skills, some pupils have been creating quizzes about their reading book.
